BASIC REGULATORY REQUIREMENTS

PART 1 - GENERAL

1.01 CERTIFICATES AND PERMITS

Secure all certificates and permits required for operation and occupancy by authorities having jurisdiction over the Work and deliver to the Designer upon issuance.

1.02 APPLICABLE CODES

- A. Comply with all applicable codes, standards, regulations and laws.
- B. The following is a list of major codes that may govern the project. It is not to be considered all inclusive of codes and regulations that may apply and current revisions and editions must be confirmed.

0780-02-02-.01 ADOPTION BY REFERENCE.

- (1) Unless otherwise provided by applicable law or the provisions of this chapter, the required minimum standards for fire prevention, fire protection and building construction safety in the State of Tennessee shall be those prescribed in the following publications:*
- (a) Except for Chapter 11 pertaining to accessibility and Chapter 27 pertaining to electrical requirements and the International Electrical Code, ICC International Building Code, 2006 edition, including ICC International Mechanical Code, 2006 edition, published by the International Code Council, Inc., 500 New Jersey Avenue Northwest, 6th Floor, Washington, D.C., 20001.*
- (b) ICC International Fire Code, 2006 edition, published by the International Code Council, Inc., 500 New Jersey Avenue Northwest, 6th Floor, Washington, D.C. 20001.*
- (c) For state buildings, educational occupancies and any other occupancy requiring an inspection by the state fire marshal for initial licensure as defined by the 2006 edition of the International Building Code, Life Safety Code (NFPA No. 101-2006), 2006 edition, published by the National Fire Protection*
